


"San Pietro in Civate will certainly be unknown to most art lovers and even to some of the more knowledgeable. Although writers from the XVIII. Century already pointed out the beauty of the works of art hidden in this simple building and their importance for the understanding of other famous monuments, it is only in more recent times that local researchers have taken a vivid interest in them. However, in the art-historical community little notice has been taken of these literature reference and of the works of art themselves. This undeserved neglect is probably mainly due to specific local characteristics of the site where the church is located: Civate is far from the main roads leading to Italy, and the little church, which lies lonely, high up in the mountains, is difficult to reach."
