Case Study

A place of confinement for political dissidents

"At that time the arrival of the boat was an event. This was always bringing new fellows from all over Italy. That day, on October 1927, I saw in the group of handcuffed people a tall, vigorous man with blue eyes behind his glasses and the hard face of someone who has been in prison. He was Carlo Rosselli, the protagonist, together with Parri and Pertini, of the escape to France of the old Turati. He was also sentenced to a five-year term.

A month later came Emilio Lussu, hero of the First World War and founding member of the Sardinian Partito D'Azione. [...] Lipari is 300 miles from the Tunisian coast, 250 miles from Malta and 400 miles from Corsica. Every landing place was under surveillance day and night. There were guards on sight along the borders of the colony and patrols in the countryside. The area reserved for prisoners was one square kilometre. For 500 deportees there were 500 policemen. Behind each deportee there was a guard. The sea was constantly watched by boats, motorboats with searchlights and machine guns.


We were thinking of escape from the day that Rosselli, Lussu and I (Nitti) made an alliance. We were only thinking of this."








